

Dorothy's Delight (The dessert that was mentioned at Dorothy Church's Memorial Service)

Crust: 1 cup flour, 1/2 cup butter (room temp.), 1 cup chopped pecans. Mix together until crumbly. Press into 9x13 pan. Bake 15 minutes at 350. Cool completely.

Next Layer: 1 8-oz cream cheese (softened), 1 cup powdered sugar. Mix together and add 1/2 large container of whipped topping (thawed). Pour over cool crust.

Next Layer: 1 large pkg instant chocolate pudding, 1 large pkg vanilla instant pudding, 3 cups cold milk. Beat together and pour over cream cheese layer. Put remaining whipped topping over pudding layer. Sprinkle with chopped up chocolate bar.
